WHAT IS A CoC?

The Western Virginia Continuum of Care (VA-513) is a network of agencies and individuals working together to build a system of care for families and individuals who are experiencing homelessness in the Shenandoah Valley.

Goal: Homelessness is rare, brief, and non-recurring.

Vision: Everyone has a safe and stable home.

HOW THE CoC OPERATES

- Facilitates a collaborative process of planning, implementing, and overseeing housing services that are inclusive, measurable, and effective
- Ensures that resources are allocated, targeted, and utilized efficiently and effectively
- Operates through established committees, of which the Executive Committee is the official governing and decisionmaking body
 - HRHA is the CoC's lead agency and fiscal agent
 - Employs 2 staff: the CoC Coordinator and the HMIS Administrator
- Advocates a housing first approach to services

- 2. Solicitation of new project/ Public Notice-August 8, 2024
- 3. Intent to Submit project applications-August 26,2024*
- 4. Submission of Applicant grant application-September 29, 2024*
- 5. Scoring of the CoC Application- 10/1-14/2024*
- 6. Notice of Project Acceptance/Rejection:10/15/2024
- 7. Application Submission: 10/30/2024
