Western Virginia CoC Collaborative Planning Activity: Barriers, opportunities, priorities, and needs


Methodology:


During the August 8, 2024 General CoC Meeting and HUD NOFO Information Session, Michael Wong conducted a four-question collaborative planning process with the 36 attendees present (both in person and virtual).


Each question had an opportunity for open-ended response. These responses were then shared for everyone to see and vote on. For the first question, each person was given one vote; for the remaining three questions, each person was able to vote for three responses.


Because some responses were very similar (i.e. "emergency shelter," "Shelters", and "shelter"), CoC staff compiled the results into unified themes that group similar responses and the votes they received into single counts. The following visualizations use these themes to show both the range of initial responses (in orange on the left) and the frequency that each response received votes (in blue on the right).
